Being fully informed about your condition and treatment will help you make the decision whether or not to undergo Botox[®] Cosmetic treatment. It is simply an effort to better inform you so that you may accept or withhold your consent for this treatment.

_____ 1. I have requested that Danna Campbell, Certified Injectionist, of Complexion Med Spa, attempt to improve my facial expression lines with Botox[®] Cosmetic, an Allergan, Inc. trademark for Botulinum Toxin A. These injections have been used for nearly two decades to improve spasm of the muscles around the eye, to correct double vision due to muscle imbalance, as well as numerous other neurological uses. The injection of small amounts weakens the muscle and prevents frowning, improves crow's feet and expression lines. Although the results are usually dramatic, I have been informed the practice of medicine is not an exact science and that no guarantees can be made or have been made concerning expected results in my case.

_____ 2. Improvement in injected areas in the forehead and around the eyes will occur within two weeks. If results are not satisfactory within two weeks of the initial injection date, please call to schedule for a Botox[®] touch-up appointment. Touch-ups will be honored at the current unit price.

_____ 3. The solution is injected with a small needle into the muscle. You will see benefits develop within the next 7-10 days. Less frowning will be possible. Typically muscle action and wrinkles will return within 3-5 months. I understand results are temporary and repeat treatments are needed to maintain the desired results.

_____ 4. Side effects and complications due to injections in the forehead muscles and around the eyes have been minimal. Occasionally slight swelling and bruising may occur at the injection site. Headaches have been reported, however it is more common for a patient to notice that the tension headaches they had experienced in the past are substantially improved after Botox injections. Diplopia (double vision) is extremely rare and I have been advised of the risks involved in such treatment, the expected benefits of such treatment, and alternative treatments, including no treatment at all.

Botox[®] Cosmetic treatment should not be administered on a pregnant or nursing woman.

I agree that this constitutes full disclosure, and that it supersedes any previous verbal or written disclosures. I certify that I have read and fully understand the above paragraphs and that I have had opportunity for discussion and to ask questions.
